

Get wind of news on turbines

THREE COMMUNITY open days are being held next week to give people more information about Fife's first commercial windfarm at Little Raith.

Kennedy Renewables started work on the site in August last year.

The community open days will give an opportunity for members of the three local communities around the site to receive an update on the construction of the windfarm.

They will also be able to speak to a representative from Kennedy Renewables.

A short exhibition will be shown outlining what has happened so far and the community will be given an update on what is still left to do.

The three community open days will be held from 2-8pm in Auchtertool Village Hall on Monday, from 2-8pm in Beath and Cowdenbeath North

Church on Tuesday and from 2-7pm in the studio room of Lochgelly Centre next Wednesday.

Kennedy Renewables chief executive Stephen Klein said: "We are delighted to announce we are hosting these open days for members of the local communities and we would like to encourage everyone to come along.

"It will be a good opportunity for members

of the community to have a chat with us and also be provided with an update on the building work still to be undertaken.

"We are pleased to report the construction of Little Raith windfarm is proceeding on schedule.

"This should allow us to start generating green energy in Fife before the end of 2012, but more information will be available at the open days."
