

# Economy reaping benefits from Little Raith project

CONSTRUCTION work at Little Raith Wind Farm, Fife's first commercial wind farm, has only been underway since the beginning of August but already Fife's local economy is reaping the benefits.

Six people from the locality are already working on-site near Lochgelly, and it is expected that up to 30 people will be working at Little Raith by the end of this year. In the current economic climate this will undoubtedly bring great benefit to the local community.

Kennedy Renewables started work on-site with Wind Prospect appointed as Project Manager and RJ McLeod as the Principal Contractor.

The initial phase of work, up until December this year, will include building roads and infrastructure to the turbine locations and the construction of the substation to enable Scottish Power to energise the site. The project is expected to take approximately 14 to 16 months with project completion scheduled for October next year just ahead of the high wind winter season.
